Congratulations to CRAB's IT team: Scott Campbell, Mike Clark, Cameron Cole, Eric Hagenlock, Walt Olsen, Kathy O'Shea and Jim Oyler, in receiving the Best of Washington IT Award for their GIS-Mo Project.

The GIS-Mo project team, led by Eric Hagenlock, has worked diligently for more than a year and a half to deliver a state of the art county road asset management system. This system combines software suites from ESRI and DTS, LLC to create a cohesive geospatial asset management system with mobile device capability. Breaking new ground, Washington State will be the first ESRI Roads and Highways implementation to onboard an entire state's county road network. The project team has been commended at every step along the way for their dedication, responsiveness, expertise, and collaborative nature. Although the project team was nominated, GIS-Mo is a collaboration between CRAB, WSDOT, WTSC, WSACE, all 39 Counties, DTS LLC, ESRI, Team Soapbox, and more.



The award was presented by Governor Jay Inslee and Washington State Chief Information Officer Jim Weaver at the Washington Digital Government Summit on November 7th in Olympia at the Hotel Red Lion.

County Engineer/PWD Changes

Summary of State Auditor's Reports Findings

Staff reported that fifty-four county audit reports representing thirty-five counties have been reviewed since the July 2019 Board meeting and two involved county road funds in some form. RAP Project Actions by CRAB Staff since July 2019:

Snohomish County contacted CRAB via letter dated August 16, 2019 requesting combination of the RATA funded 84th St NE / 115th Ave NE intersection project, milepost 1.58 - 1.78 (RAP Project # 3117-01); with the non-RATA funded 84th St NE resurfacing project, mileposts 0.63 - 1.58 and 1.78 - 2.65; AND the non-RATA funded Marine Drive, mileposts 0.00 – 1.78.

John Koster, CRAB Executive Director approved the combination with the condition that the work items related to the RATA funded project remain distinct and separate from the non-RATA funded work through the bid documents, contract plans, and billing processes, in keeping with WAC 136-170-050 - Combining of RATA funded project with non-RATA funded project. An amendment providing for the combination was executed by Snohomish County and CRAB.

Drew Woods reported to the CRABoard that the goal of the Emergency Loan Program is to provide financial assistance to counties during a disaster, and presented the proposed language for WAC 136-500, EMERGENCY LOAN PROGRAM (ELP).

He reported that no comments have been received on the CR-101's filed in August, and the next step is for the CRABoard to set a public hearing for the January 2020 CRABoard Meeting. Following discussions the Board set a public hearing regarding adoption of the new WAC language for January 30, 2020 at 2:00 pm.

SMEPJm7bQg. The first county GIS-Mo training is scheduled for November 6, 2019.


Another GIS-Mo milestone is the closeout of the DTS, LLC vendor services contract on September 25, 2019. This contract concluded 6% under budget. CRAB will continue to work with vendors, counties, staff, and other key stakeholders to implement a spatial asset management system with mobile capabilities for roadways and roadway assets by 2021 (http://www.crab.wa.gov/gis-mo). To stay informed, GIS-Mo monthly QA and Project Management (PM) status reports will be available on the OCIO IT Project Dashboard http://waocio.force.com/.

CRAB's migration effort to WaTech *Private Cloud* has experienced delays. CRAB has received a waiver to OCIO Policy 184 extending our *Private Cloud* migration to January 31, 2020. The Agency is working closely with the WaTech Private Cloud team, Network team, and Firewall team to identify solutions. Currently no service interruptions are anticipated. If necessary, a service interruption schedule will be developed and distributed to all 39 counties to plan accordingly.

Finally, CRAB offices are scheduled to relocate as of January 1, 2020. The move is within the same building and will not impact the mailing address or telephone numbers. However, communications and equipment must be relocated and reestablished. This could result in a small window of downtime for email and phone. We should be established in our new Cloud environment by this time, which means the CRAB website and web applications will still be available. When we have a firm move date, CRAB will post it to our website and email the County Engineers.
